**Areas of Interest**

*Pastoral Care:* Effective ministry responds to the need for spiritual, physical, and psychological self-awareness and healing in the lives of individuals and congregations. As a theological educator I seek to prepare caregivers who can anticipate and respond to pastoral care needs from a theological grounding that is redemptive and liberating.

*Pastoral Psychotherapy:* Both developmental psychology and depth psychologies frequently derive their understanding of health from the theological definitions of wholeness. My approach to psychoanalysis, analytical (Jungian) psychology, object relations, intersubjective, structural developmental, and family systems theories elucidates shared and conflicting values with respect to religious and ethical understandings of ultimate concern, from generation to generation and across the life cycle.

*Discernment:* Traditional approaches to discernment center on knowing and doing God's will as mediated by individual and cultural awareness. I am particularly interested in Ignatian and Quaker traditions as these relate to the process of discernment that occurs in religious experience, spiritual direction, psychotherapy and supervision.

*Care for Creation:* Given an undergraduate background in human ecology I take seriously the threat of environmental collapse with potential to endanger human communities while rending the intricate web of creation. Finding the ethical will to live in harmony with non-human life and one another is the great challenge of our time. This includes facing the threats of nuclear war, genocide, economic and social injustice, which ultimately serve to make life on earth less viable for all.
